CONVERSATIONAL VOCABULARY	ACADEMIC VOCABULARY	DOMAIN-SPECIFIC VOCABULARY
Used in everyday conversations with friends or family.	Higher-level words used across different academic subjects.	Usually used in just one specific subject OR a common word that has a different meaning in a specific subject.
Examples: friend, dog, sit, run, show, look, happy, good, lazy, mean, great, fun, table	Examples: authority, capture, portray, potential, establish, factor, feature, impact, assess, unify, clarify, assign, analyze, concur, debatable, justification	Examples: monotheism, papyrus, mummification, ziggurat, obelisk, cuneiform, aqueduct, peninsula, monarchy, patrician, plebeian
