
CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- Blessed is the man against whom the LORD counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.


- As Moses speaks to the people through God, we confess those times we do not listen to Your words and close our hearts to You.


POST-COMMUNION THANKSGIVING
